Applications are invited from eligible **unmarried Male and unmarried Female Engineering Graduates** and also from **Widows of Indian Armed Forces Defence Personnel** who died in harness for grant of Short Service Commission (SSC) in the **Indian Army**. Course will commence in Oct 2023 at **Officers Training Academy (OTA), Chennai, Tamil Nadu**.

2. Eligibility.

(a) **Nationality.** A candidate must either be :- (i) A citizen of India, or (ii) a subject of Nepal, or (iii) a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka and East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Malawi, Zaire and Ethiopia and Vietnam with the intention of permanently settling in India, provided that a candidate belonging to categories (ii) and (iii) above shall be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been issued by Government of India. Certificate of eligibility will however not be necessary in the case of candidates who are Gorkha subjects of Nepal. A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary, will attach such certificate alongwith the application.

(b) **Age Limit.**

(i) **For SSC(Tech)- 61 Men and SSCW(Tech)- 32 Women.** 20 to 27 years as on 01 Oct 2023 (Candidates born between 02 Oct 1996 and 01 Oct 2003, both days inclusive).

(ii) **For Widows of Indian Armed Forces Defence Personnel who Died in Harness Only.** SSCW (Non Tech) [Non UPSC] and SSCW(Tech)- A maximum of 35 years of age as on 01 Oct 2023.

Note. The date of birth recorded in the Matriculation/ Secondary School Examination Certificate or an equivalent examination certificate on the date of submission of application will only be accepted. No other document relating to age will be accepted and no subsequent request for its change will be considered or granted.

(c) **Educational Qualification for Applying.** Candidates who have passed the requisite Engineering Degree course or are in the final year of Engineering Degree course are eligible to apply. Candidates studying in the final year of Engineering degree course should be able to submit proof of passing Engineering Degree Examination alongwith marksheet of all semesters/years by **01 Oct 2023** and produce the Engineering Degree Certificate within 12 weeks from the date of commencement of training at **Officers Training Academy (OTA), Chennai, Tamil Nadu**. Such candidates will be inducted on **Additional Bond Basis** for recovery of the cost of training at **Officers Training Academy (OTA)** as notified from time to time as well as stipend and pay & allowances paid, in case they fail to produce the requisite degree certificate.

Note-1. ALL FINAL YEAR APPEARING CANDIDATES WHOSE FINAL YEAR/FINAL SEMESTER EXAM WILL BE SCHEDULED AFTER 01 OCT 2023 ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THIS COURSE. Candidates, who have yet to pass their degree examination, will be eligible only if they are studying in the final year of degree

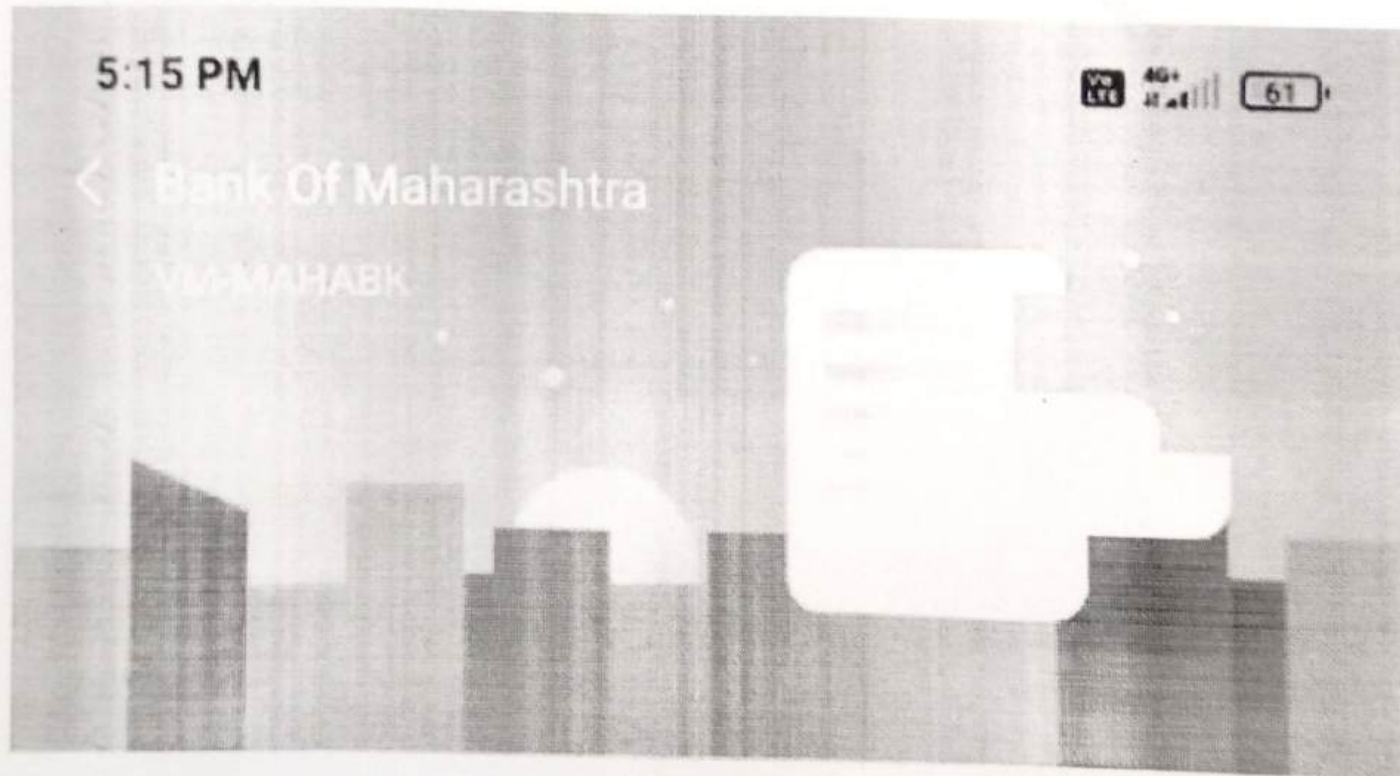

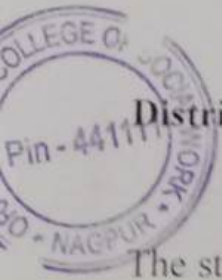

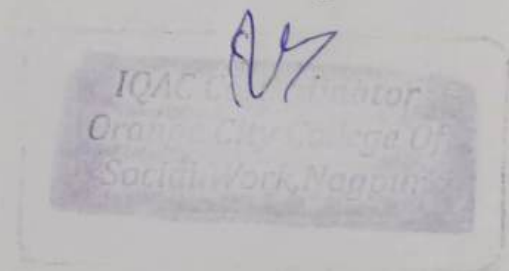


District Legal Service Authority: Doorstep Awareness regarding Law

The students and the faculties of the college created awareness and sensitisation regarding law by going door to door through the means of field work. The college collaborated with the District Legal Service Authority (DLSA) and deputed the students and the staff for creating awareness regarding the fundamental rights and duties to the people. The initiative was carried out with DLSA, for creating awareness about the same. It is often found that the common people are ignorant or oblivious regarding the rights and duties. Often they are exploited economically and socially for their ignorance. In order to sensitise the people, the students of the college were deputed for the same.

The selected students were oriented by DLSA for explaining the nuances regarding the laws and advantages to the common people. The students got trained regarding the same and were deputed at different parts of the city. The faculties of the college also joined the students to create sensitisation. It was found that most of the people, not only the poor, illiterate but also the people from the middle and upper middle class regarding the legal provisions safeguarding the fundamental rights of the people.

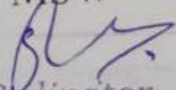
As the result of the awareness initiative by the college, it was found that many people were ignorant about not only their rights but also duties. The feedback provided by the people and the students claimed that the college was taking a lot of pain for creating sensitisation. The faculties responded that they had been able to gain knowledge about a number of things. The students were also happy that through the means of the initiative they could know many things about the law.





Doorstep Awareness Regarding Law-DLSA

The students of the college were shortlisted for the '**Doorstep Awareness Regarding Law**' campaign by **District Legal Service Authority, New Delhi**. Accordingly, the selected students from BSW and MSW were provided with orientation to visit the households in the rural and urban areas adjacent to their field work and sensitize and aware the layman regarding the law and different legal provisions in their framework. The students distributed the pamphlets regarding the legal awareness and guided the people about various provisions of the legal and constitutional framework in the month of **November, 2022**. This initiative was not only helpful in sensitizing the illiterate and laymen regarding their constitutional rights and duties but also added to the knowledge of the students regarding their legal rights. The students from BSW and MSW actively participated in the same.
