Introduction: HIV, or Human Immunodeficiency Virus, weakens your immune system by destroying important cells that fight disease and infection. Over time, HIV can destroy so many of your T-cells or CD4 cells, a key part of your immune system, that your body can't fight infections and disease anymore. When this happens, HIV infection can lead to AIDS. AIDS, or Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome, is a complex illness with a wide range of complications and symptoms. AIDS is the final stage of HIV. When individuals reach this stage, they are at high risk for opportunistic infections due to their badly damaged immune system. HIV is found in specific human body fluids. One can be infected with HIV if any of the following fluids enter your body: Blood, Semen (cum), Pre-seminal fluid (pre-cum), Breast milk, Vaginal fluids, Rectal (anal) mucous. According to HIV.gov, other body fluids and waste products—like feces, nasal fluids, saliva, sweat, tears, urine, or vomit—don't contain enough HIV to infect you, unless they have blood mixed in them and you have significant and direct contact with them.

A one day workshop on 'HIV-AIDS Awareness Programme: Breaking the Ice' by Internal Quality Assurance Cell was organized at the college. The workshop was organized with the aim of creating the awareness regarding HIV/AIDS. The chief guest of the programme **Hon. Dr. Milind Mane, Ex-MLA, Nagpur** guided the students on the need of averting oneself from the pitfalls of HIV/AIDS. There are very specific ways that HIV can be transmitted through body fluids. During sexual contact one can contract HIV through anal, oral, or vaginal sex. During sexual contact, one has contact with your partner's body fluids, which can deliver the virus into your bloodstream through microscopic breaks or rips in the linings of the vagina, vulva, penis, rectum, or mouth. During pregnancy, childbirth, or breastfeeding. Babies can contract HIV through the contact they have with their mother's body fluids—including amniotic fluids and blood—through pregnancy and childbirth. Infants can also get HIV from drinking infected breast milk. As a result of injection drug use. Needles or drugs that are contaminated with HIV-infected blood can deliver the virus directly into your body. As a result of occupational exposure. Healthcare workers have the greatest risk for this type of HIV transmission because they may come in contact with infected blood or other fluids through needle sticks or cuts. As a result of blood transfusion with infected blood or an organ transplant from an infected donor. This method of transmission is extremely rare in the United States due to screening requirements. He also shared the first hand case studies regarding the internal and external strife that the HIV/AIDS patients have to face while being tackling the disease. The patients have to face the social stigmas for no fault of their.

Ms. Prachi Bagde, a professional counselor spoke upon the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) is a retrovirus that infects cells of the immune system, destroying or impairing their function. As the infection progresses, the immune system becomes weaker, and the person

becomes more susceptible to infections. The most advanced stage of HIV infection is acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS). It can take 10-15 years for an HIV-infected person to develop AIDS; antiretroviral drugs can slow down the process even further. An estimated 36.9 million people have HIV. More than 34 million people have died from the virus, making it one of the most destructive pandemics in history. Without addressing the problems caused by the HIV virus no real progress can be made. In previous years our projects included funding for voluntary testing and counselling, through an HIV and AIDS support group at Mukuni Health Centre. However, peer education for HIV and AIDS prevention is proving to be far more effective. School leavers have received extensive training to perform workshops in schools and communities. We have sponsored some 500 AIDS orphans in education, empowering them with knowledge to avoid the spread of HIV. We provide assistance for HIV mothers and orphans and funding for treatment for patients suffering from this debilitating disease. The HIV and AIDS support group, made up entirely of volunteers, work tirelessly to sensitise the communities, help to remove the stigma and offer voluntary testing and counselling. The Butterfly Tree supports these projects in order to reduce the number of new cases. In Zambia one in six adults have HIV and in the Livingstone area, 27% of the population are living with HIV. There are also many children who have been tested positive. Every family is infected or affected by this devastating disease. Our aim is to spread awareness through education, particularly targeting school children, who can make the change.

Her discourse was followed by the speech of **Hon. Mr. Vijay Bagde, representing UNICEF at India**. He opined that it is estimated that the majority of cases where the infection has been passed on are from those with undiagnosed HIV. Once diagnosed, people are less likely to pass on their infection due to treatment and behaviour change. It's essential for both the person with HIV and those with whom they may have sex that the condition is diagnosed early. It is also important to take steps to reduce your likelihood of getting HIV. If one has unprotected sex, you could effectively be sleeping with everyone your partner's ever slept with, putting yourself at risk of getting HIV or another sexually-transmitted infection (STI). If one is sexually active one should use condoms, limit the number of sexual partners, get tested if you think you might be at risk. In the global effort to end HIV and AIDS, children and adolescents continue to fall behind. New cases of infection still occur at birth, during breastfeeding and in adolescence; and not enough children and adolescents living with HIV have access to testing and life-saving treatment. As a result, hundreds die every day. "While there has been promising progress in the HIV response, children continue to be affected by the epidemic".

Most new infections in children and adolescents occur in sub-Saharan Africa, the epicenter of HIV and AIDS. To break the cycle of new infections and deaths, children, their mothers and adolescents must be tested for HIV and linked to treatment. A top priority for UNICEF is addressing structural factors – poverty, lack of education and violence – that put people, especially adolescent girls and young women, at risk of acquiring HIV. 2.8 million children and adolescents were living with HIV in 2018 — nearly 9 out of 10 in sub-Saharan Africa. Number of children and adolescents aged 0-19 living with HIV, by country, 2018. While the progress in HIV response has been promising, children continue to be affected by the epidemic. These are some of the statistics around HIV infections among children and adolescents in 2018: 2.8 million children and adolescents are living with HIV. Only 54 per cent of infected children and adolescents are on HIV treatment as compared to 82 per cent of pregnant women living with

HIV. 360,000 new infections were estimated among children and adolescents. 120,000 children and adolescents died from AIDS-related causes. Treatment and prevention for children and adolescents are the two areas of UNICEF's work to stop HIV infections and AIDS deaths. Making sustainable gains in this work requires increased commitment, better policies and more funds at the global, regional and national levels.

Hon. Mr. Anand Chandrani, SAARTHI Trust, India guided that the longer-term treatment programs for substance-related and addictive disorders can be highly effective and typically focus on remaining drug-free and resuming function within social, professional, and family responsibilities. Fully licensed residential facilities are available to structure a 24-hour care program, provide a safe housing environment, and supply any necessary medical interventions or assistance. A few types of facility can provide a therapeutic environment, including: Short-Term Residential Treatment: This focuses on detoxification and preparing an individual for a longer period within a therapeutic community through intensive counseling; Therapeutic Communities: A person seeking long-term treatment for severe forms of addictive disorder would live in a residence for between 6 and 12 months with on-site staff and others in recovery. The community and staff serve as key factors in recovery from and changes in attitudes and behaviors toward drug use; Recovery Housing: This provides a supervised, short-term stay in housing to help people engage with responsibilities and adapt to a new, independent life without on-going substance use. Recovery housing includes advice on handling finances and finding work, as well as providing the connection between a person during the final stages of recovery and community support services; Self-Help Groups: Group therapy and long-term rehabilitation can help a person with a substance use disorder feel less isolated.

These may help the recovering individual meet others with the same addictive disorder which often boosts motivation and reduces feelings of isolation. They can also serve as a useful source of education, community, and information. Examples include Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) and Narcotics Anonymous (NA). People who struggle with other types of addiction can find out about self-help groups in their community either by an internet search or by asking a doctor or nurse for information; Medications: A person might take medication on a continuous basis when recovering from a substance-related disorder and its related complications. However, people most commonly use medications during detoxification to manage withdrawal symptoms. The medication will vary depending on the substance that the person is addicted to. Longer-term use of medications helps to reduce cravings and prevent relapse, or a return to using the substance after having recovered from addiction. Medication is not a standalone treatment for addiction and should accompany other management methods such as psychotherapy. Addiction to the following substances requires specific medications.

People with alcohol use disorder can take the following medications to reduce cravings and withdrawal symptoms, including: Naltrexone: This prevents the action of opioid receptors in the brain that produce rewarding and euphoric effects when a person consumes alcohol and reduces the risk of relapse. While not effective for all people in recovery, it has a considerable impact on abstinence in some people; Acamprosate, or Campral: This might reduce long-term withdrawal symptoms, including sleeplessness, anxiety, and a general feeling of unhappiness known as dysphoria. This has a more beneficial effect in people with severe substance-related and addictive disorders; Disulfiram, or Antabuse: This is a medication that disrupts the breakdown of alcohol, leading to adverse effects including facial redness, feeling sick, and an irregular heartbeat should the person in recovery attempt to consume alcohol. It acts as a deterrent for people who have high motivation levels toward recovery.

Doctors and rehabilitation specialists may prescribe other medication to address other possible mental health conditions, including depression and anxiety, that may be a cause or result of substance-related disorders. People in treatment programs should also receive testing for infectious diseases that might have resulted from certain high-risk situations associated with their addictive disorders such as HIV, hepatitis, and tuberculosis.

Stigma and discrimination that is directed towards people living with HIV affects us in a number of different ways. Whether it is discrimination from others in the wider community, from peers or the people closest to us, negative attitudes or prejudice can have lasting effects and limit the way we access HIV testing, treatment or other services. The consequences of stigma and discrimination are wide-ranging. Some people are shunned by family, peers and the wider community, while others face poor treatment in healthcare and educational settings, erosion of their human rights, and psychological damage. These all limit access to HIV testing, treatment and other HIV services. In 2012, the Department of Forensic Medicine Glebe refused to reconstruct the bodies of people with HIV and/or HCV after conducting an autopsy. NSW was the only jurisdiction in Australia with this policy. This policy caused unwanted disclosure and distress to partners and family members of the deceased and was particularly problematic for the families of rural and Aboriginal people with HIV.

Positive Life thought the policy unnecessary and discriminatory and considered that it reinforced and perpetuated the stigma of infectiousness attached to people with HIV and HCV. Following a submission to the Department of Forensic Medicine by Positive Life they informed us that they would develop a new technique for the restoration of bodies after autopsy which eliminated the use of the suture needle and therefore improved safety for mortuary staff. Reconstruction of HIV/HCV infected bodies was subsequently implemented following further refinement of the trialled technique. Additionally, NSW Public Health Regulation 2011 was modified whereby bodies released to funeral homes no longer had any indication of HIV or Hep C.

The worldwide HIV epidemic has created a terrible burden for millions of individuals, families and communities around the world. Relieving it requires improved healthcare, better access to treatments, more vigorous prevention efforts, more effective social outreach, and support for those most vulnerable -- particularly orphans.

But there is another terrible burden imposed by AIDS, which each and every one of us has the capacity to relieve: the burden of HIV-related stigma.

Dr. Vijayalaxmi Nandapurkar, Principal summed up the workshop by citing that But the walls of stigma and silence are weakening. There is evidence of progress on every continent. Leaders are speaking out at the highest level. The rights of people living with HIV/AIDS are being defended through the courts. Standards are being set in the workplace. Schools, the media and youth education programmes are helping to create a generation better equipped to live in the world of AIDS. And last year, at a Special Session of the General Assembly, all the Member States of the United Nations unanimously adopted a Declaration of Commitment on HIV/AIDS which sent a clear message around the world. They pledged to enact or enforce legislation outlawing discrimination against people living with HIV and members of vulnerable groups.

But whatever laws and regulations are adopted, the most powerful weapons against stigma and silence are the voices of the world's people speaking up about AIDS. By adopting the slogan "Live and Let Live," this year's World AIDS Campaign challenges us to ensure that all people, with or without HIV, can realize their human rights and live in dignity. On this World AIDS Day, let us resolve to replace stigma with support, fear with hope, silence with solidarity. Let us act on the understanding that this work begins with each and every one of us.

Some people with AIDS are being denied basic rights such as food or shelter, and dismissed from jobs they are perfectly fit to perform. They may be shunned by their community, or most tragic of all, by their own family.

The fear of stigma leads to silence, and when it comes to fighting AIDS, silence is death. It suppresses public discussion about AIDS, and deters people from finding out whether they are infected. It can cause people -- whether a mother breastfeeding her child or a sexual partner reluctant to disclose their HIV status -- to risk transmitting HIV rather than attract suspicion that they might be infected.

About ECF:

Equal Community Foundation (ECF) was founded in 2009 to raise boys to be gender equitable. We implement behaviour change programmes for boys in schools and communities in Pune, Maharashtra, and work through partnerships with organizations across India.

ECF proposes to partner with MSW programmes to engage young adults (MSW students) in a reflective exercise that will: enable them to understand the influence of patriarchy on themselves, their families, their peers and society; equip them with the knowledge and skills to become agents of change and take action for gender-equality.

Action for Equality (A/E) curriculum topics include:

- **Human Rights:** Participants learn the importance of using rights-based language in relation to gender and gender-equality. They will gain a practical understanding of the value of Human Rights. They will also be able to reflect upon and identify discrimination and human rights violations in their day to day lives.
- **Gender:** Participants will be able to distinguish between gender as a social construct and sex as a biological construct. They will be able to recognize gender norms and other practices which are social constructs and debate the value of challenging or changing these constructs.
- **Gender-transformative approach:** Participants learn about the process of changing gender norms and understand the complexities around this.
- **Peer pressure and masculinity:** Participants learn about the influence their peers have on them, especially around risk-taking behaviours during adolescence.
- **Gender and self-expression:** Participants will learn about the effect that gender norms have on the way in which we express or suppress our gender identities. Participants will learn to respect each individual's choices and stand up for each other's right to express themselves.
- **Types of violence:** Participants learn about different types of violence and understand how power, tradition, culture and norms form the root causes of violence. They also learn to appreciate that violence should be eschewed in all forms.
- **Assertive Communication:** Participants learn how aggression creates a barrier to healthy relationships and how assertive communication and respect lead to healthy relationships. They also learn the importance of consent in relationships.
- **Facilitation Skills:** Participants learn how to use facilitation methodology to create safe spaces for reflection and discussion.
- **Problem Solving (Experiential Learning Project):** Participants undertake an experiential learning project. They learn how to identify a social issue, analyze the problem, identify a solution, prepare and take action and then evaluate their impact.

Proposal

ECF proposes to engage MSW students in a gender-transformative programme which will enable them to become agents of change and allies for gender-equality.

ECF typically hosts MSW students for block placements during the summer months of April, May and June. Through their engagement with us students gain hands-on experience on how to engage adolescent boys in gender-transformative programmes. On account of the complications created by the pandemic, we are unable to host students this year, but at the same time on account of the conditions created by the pandemic, we are in a position to host trainings for a wider group of students. Hence we are keen to provide this exposure to larger groups of students through an online engagement.

Key Outcomes:

As a result of these activities, participating students will be able to:

1. Reflect upon their self identities
2. Bond together as a group
3. Use rights-based language in relation to gender
4. Identify and reflect upon human rights violations in their day to day lives
5. Distinguish between gender and sex
6. Identify and reflect upon gender norms in their lives
7. Think critically about social issues
8. Understand the stages and process of changing gender norms
9. Recognize and stand up to negative peer pressure
10. Recognise impact of gender on self expression
11. Respect individual choice related to self identity
12. Reduce violent behaviour
13. Identify violence and report it
14. Develop healthy relationships between themselves and their teachers
15. Communicate better with each other and their teachers
16. Identify a social issue on which they will prepare a project
17. Apply problem solving techniques and critical thinking to their personal lives
18. Demonstrate their critical thinking, problem solving skills and communication skills
19. Disseminate their knowledge and learnings on human rights, gender, peer pressure, sexuality, violence and communication

Overall Programme Outcome: Participants will demonstrate a positive shift in their attitudes and behaviours related to gender.

Introduction:

Orange City College of Social Work, Nagpur, Athawale College of Social Work, Bhandara, National Fire Service College, Nagpur, Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs and Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur organized a one-day National Conference on **"Disaster Management: Perspective and Reinstatement"** on Saturday, September 24, 2022. The conference was organized at Ravi Bhawan, Civil Lines, Nagpur.

Inaugural Session:

Inaugurating the inaugural session of the one-day National Conference, Hon'ble Pro. VC, RTMNU, Nagpur, Chairperson of the program Respected Dr. Chandansingh Rotele, President, OCCSW, Nagpur, ACSW, Bhandara, Chimur, MSWMSF, Nagpur, Ex. Member of Senate, Member of Academic Council, RTMNU, Nagpur. Guest of Honour, Hon. Rajesh Chaudhary, Director, National Fire Service College, Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, Shri. G. S. Saini, Hon. Ex. Director, National Fire Service College, Government of India, as special guest Hon. Dr. Ashok Borkar, HOD., of Sociology, RTMNU, Nagpur, Dr. Kedarsingh Rotele, Vice-President, OCCSW, Nagpur facilitated as the esteemed guest of the conference. During the conference, the proceeding of the conference in the UGC Care listed journal, 'NIU International Journal of Human Rights' was published at the hands of Shree Devendraji Fadanvis, Hon. Deputy Chief Minister, Govt. of Maharashtra and all the hon. Dignitaries present in the conference was concluded. He extended his best wishes to the college and appreciated the efforts taken by the institution for organizing the conference and publishing the journal.

The conference began with the University song sang by the students of the college. This was followed by the recitation of the Preamble of the Constitution of India. The program started with the lamp lighting ceremony.

The inaugurator of the conference Dr. Sanjay Dudhe sir, Hon. Pro. Vice Chancellor, RTMNU, Nagpur guided regarding the forms of disaster with references to the respective responses to the disaster. He instated that the disaster management is a significance part of the society and the responses differ including the government, private organization and their roles in the same. He said that the Covid era had been a major disaster where the people reached out to each other irrespective of the various dangers. He also appreciated the people of fire Service College who are trained to help each other by risking their lives.

His discourse was followed by the address by Mr. Rajesh Chaudhari, Hon. Director, National Fire Service College, Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs. He said that the modern infrastructure should be designed in such a way that provides sufficient exit points in case of any kind of disaster that may occur. He also enlightens regarding the different ways and means of rescuing the victims of the disasters. He also focused upon the various measures that should be adopted while the constructions of any kind of infrastructure. Unfortunately, the same are overlooked by the people. He insisted upon the need of research in the field of disaster management to create awareness regarding the same among the common people. He also explained how Covid has increased the importance of medical services of all kinds in the society. He also insisted that people should not let their guards down and be carefree as far as Covid is concerned. He also strongly hoped that the conference ekes out a good remedy and solution regarding the problem of disaster management.



The Hon. Vice- President of the institution, Dr. Kedarsingh Rotele sir guided regarding the importance of disaster management among the people. He also insisted regarding the significance of the rescue operations at the time of natural calamities. He viewed that the smart city has also created various problems like the evacuation of the water in case of heavy rain fall, which has remain unaddressed. Hence, he felt that the organizations of seminar and conferences on similar lines is extremely important. He felt that even if a disaster is unavoidable, the impact of the disaster can be mitigated with proper planning and implementation. He also stressed the need of the optimum use of organic and recycled products for saving the ecology.

Mr. G. S. Saini, Ex., Director, National Fire Service College, Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs asserted that the Covid period has been almost like house arrest for the people. However, the same had been extremely important for the welfare and safety of the people. He guided regarding the responsibility of the higher educational institutions to create awareness regarding the disaster management among the common people. He stressed that the govt. of India should ensure that the maps so sanctioned and the houses constructed should be in view of the natural disaster so as to keep the people safe. Unless this is done, the accession letters should not be sanctioned.

The role of social worker in the management and mitigation of the disaster is very important. It is the responsibility of the social work institutions to train the students and the empower them to tackle any kind of disaster. The public health sectors need social workers for dealing with the disaster. He cited the example of Japan where despite of the frequent natural disasters like super cyclone of 1999, the people are so trained to deal with the same impactfully. He also deliberated regarding the earthquake as to have the records of the same are now properly maintained. He said that, the natural disaster affected need psycho-social support.

He concluded that the climate change has resulted in to various natural disaster. The factors like coal mines production are responsible for the pollution. Hence it is the responsibility of the students, teachers and other stakeholders to manage disaster at individual, state and national level. It is important to have the core knowledge for disaster management. He concluded with his experience where he was called for a presentation on disaster management at Parliament House for presentation on safety and security, where he underlined the loopholes in security that can cause any threat and the Parliament House was attack in 2001.

Dr. Chandansingh Rotele, Hon. President, OCCSW, Nagpur, ACSW, Bhandara, Chimur, MSWEMSF, Ex. Member of Senate & Academic council, RTMNU, Nagpur, Ex. Member of NAAC Peer Team said that it is ironical that the disaster management meetings are organized in the AC offices and 5-star hotels that are far removed from the ground realities. According to him, the time management and the proper training is very important in the disaster management. The social worker has the major role to play in this where he can deal with the after effects of disaster. Similarly, NGO and government has a very important role in the same. He cited the example of various natural disasters like Tsunami and Pandemic create havoc. Later the government has to play a very important role in the prevention of the natural disaster. He stated that the natural disaster is a global problem and the proper utilization of the natural resources along with psychological motivation is important. He also elaborated his views with the examples of Latur in Maharashtra, Kedarnath in Uttarakhand and Tamilnadu. According to him, team work is important in disaster management and that every school should have a post of school social worker.



The inaugural session was conducted by Dr. Kavita Kanholkar, convenor. The guests were introduced by Prof. Dipratna Raut and the vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Nandkishor Bhagat.

First Technical Session: Disaster Management in Psychological Warfare

The first technical session was resourced by Ms. Shiwalee Deshpande, Hon. Director Prahar Samaj Jagruti Sanstha, Nagpur & Former Captain, Indian Air Force. She said that it is important that each country man should imbibe the qualities of the soldiers. She narrated her experiences during the natural disaster in Uttarakhand where the relief was provided to 11 villages with the help of all the volunteers. The 11,000 tonnes of grocery were provided as well. Even the cattle were saved during the flood in Mandakini River. She also narrated how the team of Prahar provided relief to the people of Bhuj in Rajasthan during the earthquake. She explained how the people were provided with relief by Prahar in 2019 Kerala floods. Also the work has been done during the Corona Pandemic.

He stated that a terrorist is the person who is the most scared. He also urged that a soldier should be remembered every time due to his selfless duty over the border that keeps everyone in the country safe and sound. She narrated her experience with Prahar and how the superstar Nana Patekar after meeting with Col. Deshpande came up with the idea of making the movie 'Prahar'. She strongly viewed that every citizen should have the quality of a soldier. All the educational institutions should provide compulsory training of the soldier. It is only then that the society will be disciplined and the country will become a world leader. She said that one should be like a soldier who are always ready for the mission irrespective of the details of the mission. She also explained about the proxy war and the border tensions between India and Pakistan.

With the examples of Kashmir, Khalistan the second world war, Russia and Ukraine, Iran and America war explained regarding the impact of the psychological war. She explained how the psychological war creates fear in the mind of people. Similarly, demoralization and motivation are the two sides of the same coin with regard to psychological war. The social media also play a major role in the psychological war.

The first technical session was conducted by Ms. Kalpana Mukunde and the vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Aarti Pawar.

Second Technical Session: Disaster Management Act

Mr. Ankush Gawnde, Hon. District Disaster Management Officer, Nagpur on his discussion on 'Disaster Management Act' discussed about the resilience and the way of the development of the quality of resilience by thinking and behaving in such a way that one adopts the strategy to cope with the challenging situation. He guided regarding the constitution of District Disaster Management Authority consisting of the members like collector as the chairperson, president of Zilla parishad as the co-chairperson, members from BSF, CRPF, ITPF, CISF as the important member. The supervision and command of the force is vested on the officer appointed by the central government with the designation of Director General of the NDRI. He said that most of the natural disaster occur in the Asian and the Pacific region. He also commented that the geo climatic condition and the high degree of socio-economic vulnerability makes India a disaster-prone country in the world.



The Second technical session was conducted by Prof. Rachana Dhadade and the vote of thanks was proposed by Prof. Sulok Raghuvanshi.

Third Technical Session:

Ms. Surabhi Gajbhiye, Hon. Program Director, SAAD shared her experiences regarding the Kerala flood, Latur earthquake, flash flood in Uttarakhand etc. She stressed the rehabilitation of people post pandemic and its importance. Moreover, dragging the people out of trauma is very important. Moreover, the capacity building of the people should be done. She explained her points with the example of flood in Rudraprayag, Jammu & Kashmir, Nepal earthquake in 2016 and Bihar flood.

The third technical session was conducted by Dr. Chandu Patil and the vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Arti Pawar.

Valedictory Session:

The valedictory session was graced by the presence of Dr. Chandansing Rotele, Hon. Chair of the session, Mr. Rajendra Uchake, Hon. Chief Fire Officer, NMC, facilitating as the chief guest, Dr. Aruna Gajbhiye, Hon. Freelance Researcher, writer and consultant for social development sector, Dr. Ashok Borkar, Hon. Guest, Mrs. Kirantai Rotele, Hon. Ex. Senate member, RTMNU, Nagpur. Dr. Sarala Shanware, Hon. Officiating Principal ACSW, Bhandara, Dr. Mahendrakumar Meshram, Officiating Principal, Nagpur.

Mr. Rajendra Uchake spoke at length about the pattern of work followed in the fire service department at municipal corporation. He informed regarding the relief fund provided for the national disaster events. The same is audited by PWD. He said that it is the responsibility of the Urban Development Ministry to develop the infrastructure in such a way that the disaster mitigates the impact. Similarly, the infrastructure and common public areas should be developed in such a way that the rescue operations are conveniently carried out. This also helps the conduct the planning of fire fighting and other disaster rescue operations.

Dr. Aruna Gajbhiye said that it is very important to have safety measures like fire extinguisher, the various safety measures in the different parts of schools and colleges. People are ignorant regarding the different kinds of fire extinguisher and that the expiry date of the fire extinguisher has to be checked. She said that no disaster is manmade but they are humanly induced. She focused upon the importance of waste management in the protection of ecology.

Dr. Ashok Borkar, stated that the various sociological theories are the result of the sociological risk emerging at the advent of the disaster and its concept. He also explained regarding the external factors of risk like manufactural risk that in the long run affects the society. He elaborated his discourse with the help of the theory of last classification where in the hierarchy of the society consist of the lower class that runs the entire social structure. It is headed by the higher class and the one that connects both the classes is the middle class.

Dr. Chandansingh Rotele in his presidential speech expressed that the disaster management and the reinstatement should be the first and foremost issue of relevance for the society. Unfortunately, he felt that it is conveniently ignore by the stakeholders. It is important that the people should be alert regarding the different aspects of disaster management. In this the



educational institutions have the major role to play in and the social work colleges should step forward to do so as their moral and ethical responsibility.

The session was conducted by Prof. Shalini Tore. The Vote of thanks for the conference was made by Dr. Chandrashekhar Malviya who expressed his gratitude to management, faculties and nonteaching staff of all the organizing institution. He also expressed his gratitude to the participant of the conference. He expressed gratitude to the staff of the Ravi Bhavan, Nagpur for the extension of all kind of possible support for the organization of the conference. The program was concluded with the National Anthem.

Introduction: A session on a visit at Sarthi Trust, Nagpur was organized. During the visit, Mr Anand Chandrani and Mr. Nikunj Joshi, Sarthi Trust shared their experiences along with other members with the students and faculties. During the visit, the faculties and the students interacted with the third gender community associated with the trust. Introduction: During the Special Village Camp of Orange City College of Social Work, Nagpur organized by National Service Scheme at Zilla Parishad Primary School, Khapri, Koradi, District Nagpur from 16th to 22nd February, 2023 the program on 'Organ Donation' was organized on 18th February, 2023. During the program, Mr. Anil Nimsarkar, Govt. Dental College, Nagpur said that organ donation is one of the most noble deed that glorifies the humanity and a single act of organ donation can save multiple lives.

He opined that every part of body from hair to vital parts like heart, kidney, liver, etc. holds significance in human body as they can be of use to someone else, while being alive or dead. He said that some organ transplantations like liver are significant, as they can be donated only to the one who is blood related. Moreover, the chances of successful transplantation and chances of survival even after successful transplantation are meager.

Conclusion: The program was conducted and vote of thanks was proposed by Prof. Sulok Raghuwanshi. The program was attended by the students, teaching, non-teaching staff and members of the village.

Right to Food:-

The country India is the land of festivals. In the different days of the year, innumerable festivals are celebrated with great enthusiasm and spirit. During these festivals, the feast served for the common people is the normal thing. The same goes for the functions and celebrations like Ganesh festival, Durga festivals, feast for Christmas, Eid, Moharram, Dhamachakra Pravartan Din, specially organized at Nagpur. The college has discovered that during such feast, the amount of food being wasted is in large volume. It is ironical that in country where per capita income is very low and an average Indian is deprived of even four square meal, such wastage of food is common. After observing this, the college decided to take the initiative to spread awareness regarding the food wastage. Thus the faculties and volunteers of the college visit the similar functions like Devi Puja, Ganesh festivals, Moharram, etc and started counseling the people present in the function not to waste food or water and help themselves with only that much which is required. During this, whenever the faculties and students of the college, come to know about such function, gatherings they visit the place and with the permission of the organizer counsel the people to not to waste food or water. The college believes that there is dire scarcity of the food and water in the country and if the food or water is not wasted or thrown away, the same can be accessible to many people who do not get it.

The college believes in the ideology of 'Practice What You Preach' and 'The Charity Begins at Home'. Hence this practice was started by the college at various functions organized within the college. The college organizes annual gatherings, seminar, workshop, conferences, etc. when the food is prepared and served at larger scale. During this, at the food stalls, the college displays the banners and signposts of not to waste food or water and help oneself only with the amount needed. Even during the village camp and study tours, such banners are displayed by the college so that the students, guests and the members of the adjacent community do not waste food or water.

The college tries to extend this mission beyond the premises of the institution by orienting the students to spread the message among the officials of the various agencies and the members of the community, where they work to orient and spread the awareness among the members of the GOs and NGOs to create awareness that during any kind of program organized during the field work or otherwise for that matter, not to waste the food or water as the same can satisfy the hunger or quench the thirst of someone in need of it.

Awareness on Organ Donation:-

In the country like India, where over population is a great problem, the people often die without any kind of medical aid or required help. Often, the people have to. In such a case, it is very important to create awareness regarding the importance of organ donation to the people. The Nature has made the human body rich with many organs that can be of great help to any person in any part of the world. However, it is important that people should be made aware regarding the importance of organ donation from time to time. Organ donation is one of a very noble deed that should be encouraged frequently. However, this concept is not very

prevalent among the common Indians. It is with this aim to create awareness regarding the organ donation, the college takes initiative to orient and encourage the people in the community to donate their organs. For this, the faculties and the students on the voluntary basis encourage the people at the crematorium to donate the organs like eyes, kidney, liver, skin, bone- marrow or any other organ of the body. However, this is done by maintaining the decorum and sobriety of the occasion. The faculties and the students , remain present at the graveyards with a display boards with the slogans on the organ donation so as to create awareness regarding the same. During this, the volunteer maintains complete silence and only concentrate on displaying the boards.

Whenever any one interested in the organ donation visited the volunteer, they are provided with the basic information regarding the importance of organ donation and methods of the same. However, they are also helped to gain more information on the organ donation, its ways and procedures by inviting them to the college. In the college, meeting with the officials of Government Medical College, Nagpur is arranged, who provide counseling to the people interested in the organ donation. As a matter of fact, one of the student for Ph.D in the college is placed at Government Medical College as social worker. The college tries to counsel the patients and their relatives regarding the organ donation through the said student. Besides, he is of great help to provide the opportunity to meet the people and counsel them on behalf of the college.

As a matter of fact, the **officiating Principal of the college Dr. Mahendrakumar Meshram** has with his spouse, donated their bodies to GMC.
